

# Break-out Space | Multiple Types Combined

- Multiple types of break-out spaces can be mixed together throughout academic spaces.
- These rooms can be used for specialty staff such as part time Special education, Speech, Therapists, etc. or full time staff that do not have committed space but share storage and workspace as well as other resources.
- These flexible areas are envisioned to be visible from all surrounding classrooms, allowing independent and collaborative group work.
- Teachers may elect to send students to these areas during class time while remaining in the classroom with other students or they may choose to reserve a project area for an entire class.
- Having multiple types of break-out spaces can aid in the flexibility of the building.
- A neighborhood cluster room can be changed if the school needed to add another classroom.
