The Worcester East Middle School will require Board authorization for a Project Funding Agreement at a later time.

Discussion

The OPM and Designer conducted a feasibility analysis of the facilities and developed schematic designs including proposed scopes of work, schedules, and estimated budgets. The District's Designer, SLAM Collaborative, recommends a window/door and boiler replacement project at the Columbus Park Preparatory Academy; a window/door replacement project at the Tatnuck Magnet School; and a window/door replacement project at the Worcester Arts Magnet School. The Designer also recommends code required accessibility upgrades at all three of the facilities. The Designer confirmed that all window/door, boiler, and associated work at each of the schools will be in compliance with the MSBA's sustainability requirements.

MSBA staff reviewed the consultants' existing conditions analysis and proposed schedule provided by the District and have discussed the scopes and budgets with the District and its consultants. The District has provided a combined Total Project Budget of \$5,706,698 which includes a combined total construction cost of \$4,651,820. Construction costs include:

- Columbus Park Preparatory Academy
 - \$117/sf for windows and demolition
 - \$280,024 for abatement and associated work
 - \$164,207 for boiler replacement
- Tatnuck Magnet School
 - \$128/sf for windows demolition
 - \$179,215 for abatement and associated work
- Worcester Arts Magnet School
 - \$121/sf for windows and demolition
 - \$224,019 for abatement and associated work

Code-required accessibility upgrades totaling \$184,232 will be installed at all three of the facilities.

MSBA staff recommends a combined Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$4,190,790 for the three projects; however, the District may be eligible for up to an additional \$194,948 in grant funds, subject to the MSBA's review, approval, and audit of the District's owner's and construction contingency expenditures. Accordingly, staff recommends a combined total Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$4,385,738 for the Project Funding Agreements for a window/door and boiler replacement project at the Columbus Park Preparatory Academy; a window/door replacement project at the Tatnuck Magnet School; and a window/door replacement project at the Worcester Arts Magnet School.

² Scope exclusions/ineligible costs include consultant costs in excess of the 20% soft cost cap at the Columbus Park Preparatory Academy. At the Columbus Park Preparatory Academy, Tatnuck Magnet School, and the Worcester Arts Magnet School, the scope exclusions/ineligible costs include permit fees and costs associated with mailing and moving.

³ Does not include any grant funds for potentially eligible owner's or construction contingency expenditures; subject to MSBA review, approval, and audit.

⁴ Includes maximum possible owner's and construction contingency grant funds, the final amount of which, if any, shall be determined by the MSBA in its sole discretion. The MSBA does not anticipate that the District will expend all of its contingency funds on expenses that are eligible for MSBA reimbursement.
