SUBJECT: Status Update for Supplemental Grants

DATE: April 17, 2024

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide an update on the status and next steps for projects approved for adjustments to their Maximum Total Facilities Grants at the October 25, 2023, Board of Directors meeting (See: "Approved Legislation, Commonwealth of Massachusetts FY24 Budget Recommendation on Approve Supplemental Grants", October 18, 2023).

Background

On October 25, 2023, the MSBA Board of Directors authorized the Executive Director to adjust the Maximum Total Facilities Grants for two categories of projects:

- 1) Projects that received Project Scope and Budget approval by the MSBA's Board of Directors prior to October 1, 2022, and have accepted or will accept bids on or after January 1, 2022, per the approved legislation in the Commonwealth's Fiscal Year 2024 Budget. Staff recommended adjustments for these projects commensurate with the positive funding limits approved by the Board of Directors on December 21, 2022. The approval included but was not limited to authorization to increase Building Cost funding limits to \$393 per eligible square foot and to increase Sitework funding limits to \$39 per eligible square foot.
- 2) Projects that received Project Scope and Budget approval by the MSBA's Board of Directors after October 1, 2022, and prior to October 1, 2023. The approval included authorization to increase Building Cost funding limits to \$516 per eligible square foot and to increase Sitework funding limits to \$52 per eligible square foot.

Discussion

As noted above, there are two categories of projects that have been approved to receive supplemental grants. Staff have completed an initial review of what will be required to execute the increased grants, have begun to issue updated revised budgets and the corresponding Project Funding Agreement Amendments, and have begun to process reimbursement requests. Staff are further reviewing the steps needed to clearly identify the increased funding sought and reimbursed for each project. Staff will work with each district to assist in the identification and development of reimbursement requests.

<u>Category 1</u>, which has a total of 30 projects, has been further subdivided into two groups. The funding limit increases approved for this Category mainly increase the construction funding limits. Therefore, staff are prioritizing the implementation of the revised Project Funding

Agreements based on the status of the bid date for the project as well as the physical progress of the construction. Estimated schedules are provided below but will be contingent upon the MSBA receiving the information required from the districts.

- Group 1, as shown in Attachment A, has a total of 13 projects that have completed the actions needed to update their initial Project Funding Agreement Bid Amendment or are nearly complete. As of early April, staff have:
 - Issued revised budgets including the increased funding limits for the 13 projects in this group.
 - Received 10 retroactive reimbursement requests for review with payments issued to eight. Staff anticipate issuing payment to the remaining three of 10 by the end of April.
 - o Issued 11 Project Funding Agreement Amendments, and subsequently received and executed 10 Amendments.
- Group 2 has a total of 17 projects. Group 2 has been further subdivided into Group 2a (Attachment B) and Group 2b (Attachment C). Group 2b represents the projects with the latest anticipated receipt of bids. Within Group 2b, one additional project has received its final bids since February 2024 leaving two projects that have not yet reported final bids as of early May. As of early April, staff have:
 - o Issued Project Funding Agreement Amendments to the six projects in Group 2b, and subsequently received and executed five Amendments.
 - o Issued revised budgets including increased funding limits for four of the 11 projects in Group 2a.
 - o Issued Project Funding Agreement Amendments to three projects in Group 2a, and subsequently received and executed two Amendments.
 - Staff anticipate sending the updated project budgets to the remaining seven projects in Group 2a by the end of May.

<u>Category 2</u>, as shown in Attachment D, has nine projects that have been approved by the MSBA Board of Directors for Project Scope and Budget after October 1, 2022, and prior to October 1, 2023. Staff have:

• Issued Project Funding Agreement Amendments to the nine projects, and subsequently received and executed the nine Amendments.

With Amendments executed, no further immediate action is required for projects in Category 2. As the Districts proceed with their projects, they will be reimbursed at the higher funding levels approved at the October 25, 2023 Board of Directors meeting.

MSBA staff are continuing to work with each district to take the steps necessary to process Project Funding Agreement Amendments.
