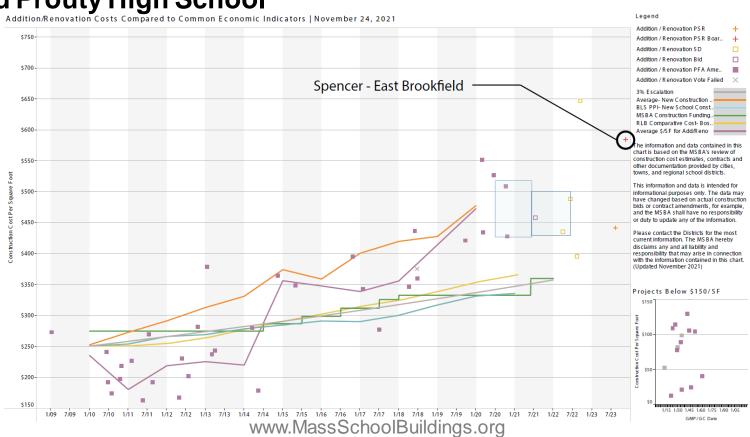

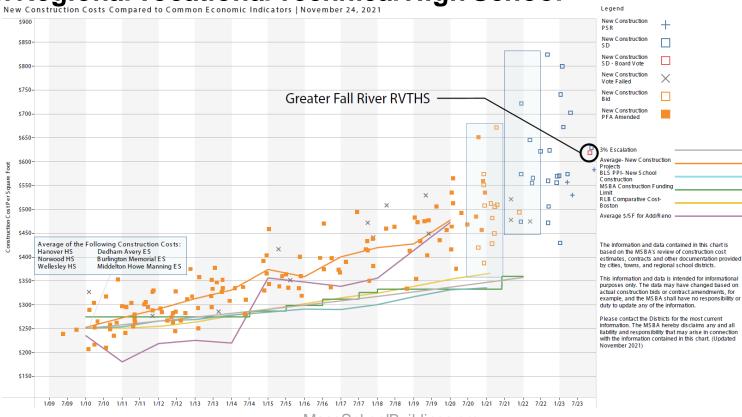

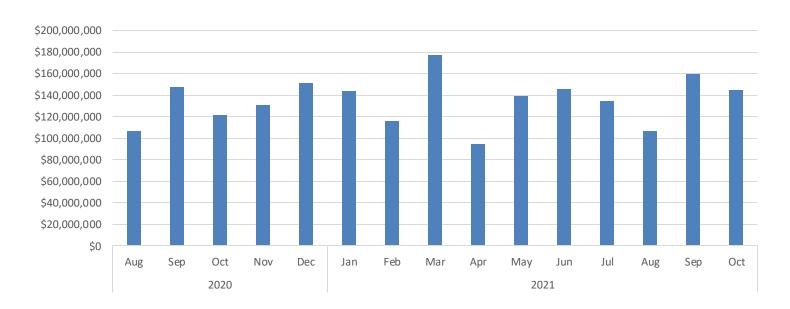

MSBA Updates

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Project Update: Northeast Metropolitan Regional Vocational School District

- Project Scope and Budget Approval: August 25, 2021.
- 120-day deadline to secure local authorization: December 23, 2021
- The District reported they had secured affirmative action (or non-disapproval) from 10 of the District's 12 member communities with the funding disapproved by the Town of Saugus at their October 18, 2021 Special Town Meeting and the City of Chelsea at their October 18, 2021 City Council Meeting.
- Per M.G.L. Chapter 71, Section 16 (d), this constitutes an over-all failed (project) vote. The District requests an extension to conduct a District-wide referendum under Chapter 71, Section 16 (n).
- Staff supports an additional extension of time through March 2, 2022 so that the District can conduct a referendum vote for the proposed project on January 25, 2022.

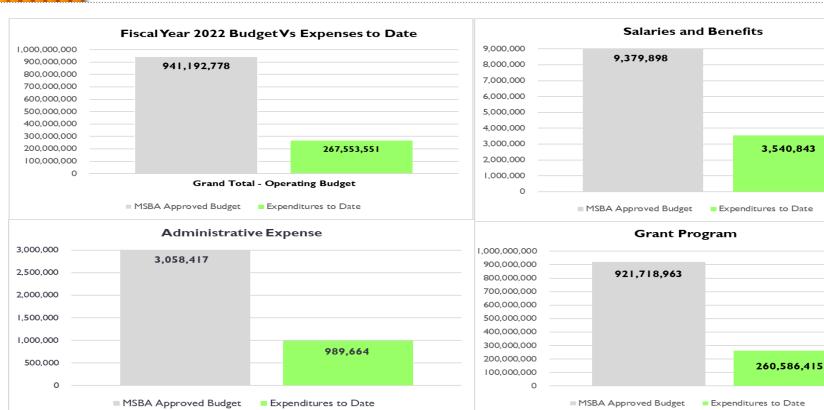


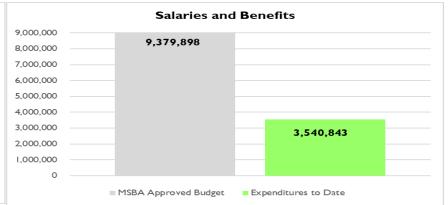
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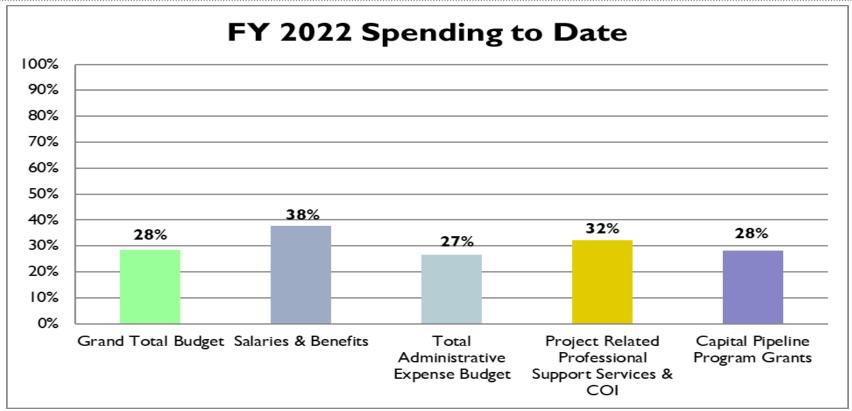
Fiscal Year 2022 Budget vs Actuals
