Discussion

At the October 27, 2021 Board of Directors meeting, the City of Boston received invitation to the Accelerated Repair Program for four potential projects, including a potential partial boiler replacement project at the Dr. William W. Henderson K-12 Inclusion Upper School based on the information provided in their Statement of Interest. At the time of invitation, staff understood the building to have two distinct and separate heating systems resulting in the invitation of Boiler Section 1 and not Boiler Section 2. Following review of the Schematic Design submission, staff understand that Boiler Section 1 is the only boiler section in the building. The existence of only Boiler Section 1 was memorialized in the 2022 Statement of Interest for the Dr. William W. Henderson K-12 Inclusion Upper School, which received invitation for a roof replacement project at the October 26, 2022 Board of Directors meeting. Consequently, the recommendation is for a boiler replacement project based on the confirmed Boiler Section 1.

The OPM and Designer conducted a feasibility analysis of each facility and developed Schematic Designs including proposed scopes of work, schedules, and estimated budgets. The District's Designer, Habeeb & Associates Architects, Inc., recommends a window and door replacement project at the Boston Day and Evening Academy, a boiler replacement project at the Dr. William W. Henderson K-12 Inclusion Upper School, a window and door replacement project at the Rafael Hernandez K-8 School, and a boiler replacement project replacement project at the William E. Russell Elementary School. The Designer has confirmed that the window and door replacement projects and the boiler replacement projects will be in compliance with the MSBA's sustainability requirements.

MSBA staff reviewed the consultants' existing conditions analyses and proposed schedules that were provided by the District. Also, MSBA staff discussed the scopes and budgets for the projects with the District and its consultants.

At the Boston Day and Evening Academy, the District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$7,286,315, which includes a construction cost of \$5,705,084. Construction costs include:

- \$3,313,333 (\$358.16/sf) for aluminum window systems and associated demolition;
- \$377,981 for miscellaneous demolition and hazardous material abatement;
- \$160,207 for exterior door installation and associated demolition;

- \$247,644 for carpentry and woodwork;
- \$283,245 for waterproofing, damp proofing, and caulking;
- \$300,465 for masonry and lintels;
- \$345,948 for gypsum board assemblies and painting;
- \$192,238 for roller shades;
- \$91,586 for metal grates at windows;
- \$368,155 for other associated window and door replacement work;
- and \$24,282 for accessibility compliance upgrades.

At the Dr. William W. Henderson K-12 Inclusion Upper School, the District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$4,527,987, which includes a construction cost of \$3,505,625. Construction costs include:

- \$2,513,355 for the installation of four boilers (gas fired, 5,555 MBH each);
- \$323,211 for associated boiler demolition and hazardous material abatement;
- \$273,657 for miscellaneous HVAC work;
- \$16,597 for concrete pads
- \$15,680 for louvers;
- \$61,065 for painting and specialties;
- \$14,792 for fire protection;
- \$69,524 for plumbing;
- \$195,351 for electrical;
- \$2,958 for electrical fees and permits (ineligible for reimbursement);
- \$11,077 for other associated boiler work;
- and \$8,358 for accessibility compliance upgrades.

At the Rafael Hernandez K-8 School, the District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$6,420,016, which includes a construction cost of \$4,686,782. Construction costs include:

- \$2,510,906 (\$387.49/sf) for aluminum window systems and associated demolition;
- \$391,827 for miscellaneous demolition and hazardous material abatement;
- \$92,108 for exterior door installation and associated demolition;
- \$304,800 for carpentry and woodwork;
- \$336,161 for waterproofing, damp proofing, and caulking;
- \$320,845 for gypsum board assemblies and painting;
- \$134,293 for roller shades;
- \$14,277 for metal grates at windows;
- \$380,739 for other associated window and door replacement work;
- and \$200,826 for accessibility compliance upgrades.

At the William E. Russell Elementary School, the District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$4,346,228, which includes a construction cost of \$3,234,828. Construction costs include:

• \$1,985,776 for the installation of three boilers (gas fired, 3,663 MBH each);

- \$455,312 for associated boiler demolition and hazardous material abatement;
- \$273,472 for miscellaneous HVAC work;
- \$41,225 for concrete pads;
- \$43,194 for fresh air areaway and louvers;
- \$100,018 for painting and specialties;
- \$14,782 for fire protection;
- \$54,694 for plumbing;
- \$175,868 for electrical;
- \$2,956 for electrical fees and permits (ineligible for reimbursement);
- \$18,424 for other associated boiler work;
- and \$69,107 for accessibility compliance upgrades.

MSBA staff recommends the Estimated Total Facilities Grants and the Maximum Total Facilities Grants set forth in the table below, subject to MSBA approval and audit:
